REVIEW OF DOLPHIN MORTALITY LIMITS (DMLs) FOR 2021 AND 2022

This report presents details about the utilization of Dolphin Mortality Limits (DMLs) in 2021 and 2022.

The overall limit for the fleet, each year, has been 5,000, and the portion available for distribution 4,900; the difference constitutes the Reserve DML Allocation (RDA), utilized at the Director's discretion for extraordinary cases.

The situation for 2021 was as follows:


