




Number of sets by type (1979-2008)




Total Dolphin Mortality (1959 - 2008)







Problem: Major Gear Malfunctions


MPS 2008:

SOLUTIONS:


- Gear maintenance

Problem: Net Collapse


MPS 2008:

- No net collapse: 0.19




SOLUTIONS:


- Avoid strong currents
- Maintain gear
- Set downwind
- Tow vessel and net
- Minimize set delays
- Herd dolphins away from the collapse
- Backdown with proper arc





Percentage of dolphin sets with zero mortality








Comparison of the number of dolphin left in the net
after backdown, and mortality














Number of dolphin sets by latitude



Cumulative % of dolphin sets by latitude




Cumulative % of dolphin sets by longitude


