i. Why strengthening the regional cooperation?

- \rightarrow According to international instruments, the main mechanism for organizing cooperative management is through international bodies such as RFABs/RFMOs
- \rightarrow Fisheries global issues must/can be addressed at regional level and requires coordination in response to country needs
- \rightarrow Main international processes (UNGA, CBD, WTO, BBNJ process) are evidencing the need of RFABs/RFMOs role
- → RSN and its members are recognized as key actors in regional cooperation for Countries to deliver Agenda2030
- → RSN and its members positioned in international processes and agendas generate/increase political will and commitment at country level
